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RULES & GUIDELINES

1. Entries may be made Wednesday, August 8th between 7:00 AM and 11:00 AM in the new Grafton Building Exhibit Hall.
2. All entries of fresh fruit, field crops and vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor.
3. Exhibitor shall be limited to one entry each variety per person or family.
4. Grapes, prunes, plums, etc. must not be polished. The bloom, as it is called, must be left on them.
5. Individual exhibits must have a mark of identification on the bottoms of their exhibits of fruit, field crops, and vegetables. It may be an initial and must be on the bottom of the container in which it is to be exhibited in.
6. Each of the exhibits, regardless of whether it is fruit or vegetable, should have the following qualities:
 - *Trueness to type of the particular variety. Only one type of variety should be used in the same exhibit.
 - *Good market quality, not too small or too large.
 - *Uniformity in the size, shape, color, and maturity.
 - *Without insect or disease injury or mechanical injury. They should be clean and ready for judging.
 - *All exhibits should be labeled correctly according to their variety.
 - *Extra large produce will be given special consideration.
7. Any questions on how to display will be answered by the personnel in the display area when the produce is brought in.
8. All produce must be picked up no earlier than Monday, August 13th between 9:00 AM and Noon to avoid disrupting the spirit of the fair. Please indicate on your ticket if you want your items taken to Dixie Care & Share.

It can also be a means of adding real beauty and interesting completion to the fair. Each farmer or family who enters this division will be given a minimum of 8x8 square feet.

The display must be set up and complete for judging by 11:00 AM, Wednesday, August 8th.

The display will be judged on the following basis:

Variety of fruit and nuts	20 pts.
Variety of vegetables & field crops	20 pts.
Quantity & Quality of products	30 pts.
Theme of display	10 pts.
Artistic arrangement & general effect	20 pts.
