Thursday, April 10 from 8:00AM to 11:00 AM in the Harmony Building at Washington County Legacy Park

GENERAL RULES & GUIDELINES:

1. All entries of fresh fruit, field crops, and vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor.
2. Each of the entries, regardless of whether it is fruit or vegetable, should have the following qualities:
 - a. Trueness to type of particular variety. Only one type of variety should be used in the same exhibit.
 - b. Good market quality, not too small or too large.
 - c. Without insect or disease injury or mechanical injury.
 - d. All exhibits should be labeled correctly according to their variety.
3. Any questions on how to set up your display will be answered by the personnel in the display area when the produce is brought in on April 10.
4. Exhibitors may each enter up to 3 entries in the classes listed below.
5. All produce/entries must be picked up no later than Monday, April 21 between 9:00AM and 5:00PM to avoid disrupting the spirit of the fair. Items left unclaimed will be taken to the Extension Office to be picked up until April 30.
6. Entries made in this department are limited to legal residents of Washington County.
7. Premiums may be redeemed at the premium bank during the designated hours. Premiums not redeemed by Monday, April 21, at 5:00PM may be redeemed at the Washington County Treasurer's Office at 111 East Tabernacle, St. George. All premiums must be redeemed by May 30, 2025 or the premium will be forfeited.
