ENTRY TIMES:

Thursday, April 3rd from 8:00AM to 6:00PM Friday, April 4th from 9:00AM to 1:00PM Perishable Food items must be entered on Thursday, April 10th from 8:00AM to 11:00AM. <u>GENERAL RULES & GUIDELINES:</u>

- 1. Ages 9 and older. For those younger than 9, please see page 12 for children.
- 2. An exhibitor may enter a total of 25 items. The same item may not be duplicated in more than one department.
- Claim tickets will be given when the items are entered and must be presented to claim money and articles. The owner of the item is the only one who can collect the premium. Parents will be allowed to pick up premiums for child.
- 4. All entries must be completed and clean.
- All entries must be the work of the exhibitor. Any irregularity in the entry, or fraud by misrepresentation or otherwise detected before or after the awards are made, shall cause the forfeiture of the money which will be withheld by the fair board.
- Entries exhibited at previous county or state fair contests will not be entered for competition and can be on display only.
- Entries made in this department are limited to legal residents of Washington County. Entries made by non-county residents will be for display only.
- 8. 4-H members **cannot** enter articles in both Home and Fine Arts Division and 4-H, as 4-H is judged differently.

- 9. The Danish System of judging will be used. The judges will not award money unless the articles are deemed worthy of merit. If articles are not worthy of first premium money, the judges may award second, third or no premium money, according to their judgment. We encourage high-quality items only.
- 10. All rules governing entries will be enforced.
- 11. Entries must be picked up on Monday, April 21 between 9:00AM and 5:00PM in the Harmony Building. Items left unclaimed will be taken to the Extension Office to be picked up by April 30th.
- 12. Premiums may be redeemed the premium bank during the designated hours.
 Premiums not redeemed by Monday, April 21, at 5:00 pm may be redeemed at the Washington County Treasurer's Office at 111 East Tabernacle, St. George. All premiums must be redeemed by May 30, 2025 or the premium will be forfeited.
- 13. All entries must be finished within the past year, April 2024–April 2025.

Absolutely no entry may be reclaimed until Monday, April 21, from 9:00AM to 5:00PM to avoid disrupting the spirit of the fair.

RULES & GUIDELINES FOR CANNING

1. A completed entry label must accompany each product entered. The required information must include: the processing date, method (water bath or pressure canner), time, and lbs. of pressure used. (Use the canned food entry label on the next page.)

2. All items must be the work of the exhibitor.

3. All preserved food must be displayed in a clear, standard canning jar. Quarts are preferred, but pints are acceptable. All jars should be sealed with NEW standard lids and rings. (NO mayo jars, etc.)

- 5. All fresh fruits, jams, and jellies must be processed in a boiling water bath and sealed.
- 6. Products exhibited must have been prepared no earlier than April 2022.
- 7. Mold disqualifies a product.
- 8. No entries that need to be refrigerated.
- 9. All rules governing entries in the general Home Arts department will be enforced.
- 10. All vegetables and meats must be processed in a pressure canner.
- 11. Exhibits should be canned using USDA, Ball, or Kerr guidelines issued 1999 or later.

RULES & GUIDELINES FOR BAKED GOODS

Enter Thursday, April 10th from 8:00AM to 11:00AM

- 1. All baked goods must be accompanied by recipe on a 3x5 card or list of ingredients.
- 2. Items must be displayed on a paper plate inside a Ziploc bag.
- 3. Breads should be wrapped in clear plastic wrap or a Ziploc bag.
- 4. No entries accepted that require refrigeration.
- 5. Box cakes are accepted for decoration only.

CLASS 08: Yeast & Quick Breads

(Wheat, sweet rolls, rolls, cornbread, muffins, sweet breads, etc.)

CLASS 09: Cookies

(At least 3 uniform pieces.) Examples include: drop, no bake, bar, etc.

CLASS 10: Cakes, Pies, Pastries

(No dairy or egg-based pies that require refrigeration.)

CLASS 11: Decorated Cake

(Will be judged on decorating only.)

CLASS 12: Decorated Cupcakes and Cookies

(Will be judged on decorating only.)

CLASS 13: Candies & Confections

(6 uniform pieces) Cooked or uncooked.

CLASS 14: Miscellaneous Food Items

(At least 1 cup to make a good display.) Examples include: fancy popcorn, trail mix, snacks, granola, etc.

CLASS 15: Herb & Oil Bottles

(Judged on appearance only.)

CLASS 16: Wine

(Judged on appearance only.)
